

Chen Wu-Tung Need-based Scholarship Application Provisions

Passed by the 2008 Academic Year's 2nd Student Financial Assistance Management Committee Meeting on October 27, 2008

Passed by the 2009 Academic Year's 1st Student Financial Assistance Management Committee Meeting on January 12, 2009

Passed by the 2013 Academic Year's 1st Student Financial Assistance Management Committee Meeting on December 30, 2013

Article 1. These Provisions are established to effectively utilize Longwalk Marketing Co., Ltd. Mr. Chen Wu-Tung's Need-based Scholarship, to assist students at risk of discontinuing their education due to family or economic factors, and to encourage them to strive for the best results, in order that the students can give back to society after completing their education.

Article 2. Eligible students: Students at this school's doctoral, master's, and undergraduate programs (including freshmen) who meet one of the following conditions:

1. Both parents are deceased; one parent is deceased; or the student is from a single-parent family, with a difficult life and without financial support;
2. Either parent is gravely ill, incapable of gainful employment, and with a difficult life;
3. From low-income household;
4. Family annual income below NT\$ 800,000;
5. Either parent or legal guardian of the student becomes unemployed involuntarily, such that the student discontinuing his or her education is a definite possibility.

Article 3. Assistance amount: NT\$10,000 per student

Article 4. Application deadline: The scholarship is open to applications within one month after the semester begins. The time is separately announced.

Article 5. Document submission:

1. Application form;
2. A copy of Student ID Card;
3. Entrance Examination Results are required for freshmen; other students need to attach an academic record of the previous semester;
4. Autobiography and a detailed description of family background, evidence of annual household income (parents and unmarried siblings);
5. A copy of the household registration record from within the last three months;
6. Unemployment (re)verification, unemployment benefit application and payment

receipt, relevant documents proving the student's family undergoing unexpected hardship, or diagnosis certificate from a public or private hospital if a family member is inflicted with severe illness.

If the aforementioned information is found to be forged or tampered, this school may demand the return of the already paid amount of the scholarship.

Article 6. The scholarship recipient must write a letter expressing his or her gratitude to the benefactor.

Article 7. Review process: After being reviewed and approved by the Division of Student Affairs' Scholarship Review Committee, it is submitted to the Student Financial Assistance Management Committee for retroactive recognition.

Article 8. These Provisions are passed by the Student Financial Assistance Management Committee, and are implemented after approval. The same procedures shall apply to amendments which may arise.
