

National University of Kaohsiung Dormitory

Code of Conduct

- I. This code of conduct is established based on the “National University of Kaohsiung Student Dormitory Regulations” and “National University of Kaohsiung Student Housing Contract.” Students living in this school’s dormitory are obligated to abide by this code.**
- II. The dormitory area indicated by this code of conduct includes the dormitory lounge, stairs, elevators, hallways, laundry rooms, and bedrooms.**
- III. A point deduction system will be implemented in dealing with students who violate regulations, and parents will be contacted as well:**
- (I) 3 points will be deducted for the following types of violations:
1. Noisy or boisterous behavior, or interfering with the sleep or study of other students within the dormitory area.
 2. Not properly throwing away or sorting garbage, or causing the dormitory environment to be unsanitary.
 3. Raising pets or feeding animals within the dormitory area.
 4. Installing locks on dormitory rooms without prior permission.
 5. Moving to another dormitory room or occupying another person’s berth space without going through proper procedures.
 6. Purposely damaging common property.
 7. Smoking within the dormitory area.
- (II) 5 points will be deducted for the following types of violations:
1. Using refrigerators, electric stoves, electric rice cookers, heaters, electric blankets, or electric appliances over 500 Watts and other items which may pose concerns of fire safety.
 2. Blocking entrances and exits with objects so as to disrupt access control and safety.
 3. Taking part in activities which pose safety concerns or disturb the tranquility of the dormitory without requesting approval (such as: setting off fireworks or firecrackers, bonfire parties, cooking, etc.)
 4. Hanging around hallways, between stairs (elevators), laundry room, lounge, or

other areas of the dormitory of the opposite sex without the permission of dormitory counselors between 10:00 pm and 9:00 am.

5. Carrying any dangerous or forbidden materials into the dormitory.

(III) 7 points will be deducted for the following types of violations:

1. Gambling, drinking alcohol, antagonistic behavior, or inciting fights within the dormitory area.

2. Providing dormitory space for gatherings or activities for non-residents so as to disturb the tranquility of the dormitory.

3. If a student has raised or fed animals within the dormitory area and this fact has been verified 3 times.

4. Allowing a non-resident guest or member of the opposite sex to stay in the dormitory room without the permission of dormitory counselors between 10:00 pm and 9:00 am if violation is not severe.

5. Hanging out in the dormitory of the opposite sex between 10:00 pm and 9:00 am without the permission of dormitory counselors if violation is not severe.

6. Stealing if verified.

(IV) Students will receive a deduction of 10 points, be immediately evicted, not have their security deposits refunded, and be subject to discipline as outlined in the rules concerning incentive and disciplinary measures for the following violations:

1. Giving up a berth space to others without permission, holding berth spaces, or preventing others from moving in.

2. Fighting within the dormitory area.

3. Using or having illegal drugs onto the dormitory area.

4. Failing to participate in disaster evacuation drills without reason.

5. Obstructing access with a fire extinguisher or other objects.

6. Bringing someone of the opposite sex into the room without the consent of all roommates.

7. Entering the dormitory room of a member of the opposite sex without the consent of all residing there.

8. Allowing members of the opposite sex to stay overnight.

IV. Guidelines for Deductions and Appeals:

(I) Students with 10 accumulated deduction points must move out of the dormitory within 2 weeks and will not be allowed to apply for dormitory accommodation.

(II) The Dormitory Life Self-Regulation Committee and dormitory counselors will be responsible for implementing deductions for students who violate relevant regulations. Dissents concerning rulings will be submitted to the Division of Student Affairs Student Counseling Office for appeal.

- (III) If there is a violation as stipulated in Article 3, the Student Counseling Office must take the motives, background, and other factors concerning the violation into consideration. The student may perform service for the school, or perform other tasks to make amends for violations after approval by the Dean of Student Affairs.

V. Details of Service for School:

- (I) 3 points will be restored for 4 hours of service in which the student actually assists in the maintenance of dormitory sanitation and the beautification of its environment.
- (II) 3 points will be restored for students who actually contribute to maintaining dormitory order and public safety.
- (III) 5 points will be restored for students who proactively facilitate dormitory activities and participate in its public duties.
- (IV) 7 points will be restored for students who actually prevent the occurrence of illegal activities.
- (V) The restoration of points in other cases in which a student makes an actual contribution will be assessed based on the situation.

VI. Rules for Having Guests in Rooms: All residents in one room must create and agree upon rules for having guests that shall not violate this code of conduct. Guests of the opposite sex may not enter dormitory rooms during restricted hours. All responsibility for damage arising from these rules shall be ascribed to dormitory room residents.

VII. This code of conduct is implemented after being passed by Dormitory Student Committee and approved by the Division of Student Affairs. The same procedures shall apply to amendments which may arise.
